



So, come. *All* are welcome.



For thine is the kingdom,



ABOUT COMMUNION

All are welcome to receive the Lord's Supper. Please wait in your pew until the usher indicates that it is your turn, then come forward using the center aisle. If you and/or your children are not comfortable participating in the Rite of Communion, **know that all are still welcome to come forward for a blessing – just let the presider know your preference when you and/or your children are at the rail**. When you are at the front, please fill in a vacant spot at the altar rail. You may either kneel or stand, whichever is most comfortable for you. If you would like a gluten free alternative to the bread, or If you prefer grape juice instead of wine, please indicate that to the appropriate provider. After you have communed, please discard the empty cup to be recycled in the trash can by the side wall before returning to your seat.

COMMUNION INVITATION AND DISTRIBUTION

Pastor: The risen Christ is made known to us in the breaking of the bread. Come and eat at God's table.



(when all in the sanctuary have been fed)

Pastor: Those joining us online – pick up your bread and hear these words: *This is the body of Christ given for you.* Eat and receive saying, "**Amen.**"

> Lift up your cup of wine or juice and hear these words: *This is the blood of Christ shed for you.* Drink and receive saying, "**Amen.**"

COMMUNION BLESSING

Pastor: The body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ strengthen you and keep you in his grace.

All: Amen.

PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION

Leader: Let us pray: Shepherding God, you have prepared a table before us and nourished us with your love. Send us forth from this banquet to proclaim your goodness and share the abundant mercy of Jesus, our redeemer and friend.
