

## SETTLING IN AND GETTING TO KNOW YOU


Greetings! As I am writing this, Neeva and I have been here for a bit over a month. We so much appreciate the hospitality and love the congregation has shown us. We feel right at home here. I also want to take this opportunity to thank all of you who helped make my installation service so special, from all the planning, to the music, to the food, to the beautiful floral center pieces, to being there to celebrate this important milestone as we are start-

when there is a need. That was certainly one of the qualities that attracted me to KLC, alongside your hospitality and our shared values.

I have spent some time getting "settled in," as well as meeting with committees, staff, and lead-



ers, to gain a deeper understanding of the various ministries at KLC, and how I might plug in. I have appreciated the openness to some of the ideas I bring, yet I am also quite intentional in learning the structure and traditions that are important here at KLC.

One of the things I believe is so important in a healthy church is a strong sense of community, both within, as well as how we fit and function in

the larger context.

The reality for most congregations is that the pandemic took quite a toll on exactly that. But it also forced us to become more creative in thinking about

alternative ways of keeping a sense of community during such a difficult time. Many congregations developed online worship, which I think is so well done here at KLC! Many of us learned how to use



zoom. And I think we learned a few things from this, which we have continued to reap the benefits from, even as we are moving more into a "post-pandemic" era. Sometimes Zoom can be very convenient for meetings, as well as for online worship, especially as we consider our members who cannot easily leave their homes. It is also a great way of offering worship across great distances. We can certainly reach a lot more folks this way.

But I will also caution us not to simply get stuck on the convenience factor but let us consider the



importance of community. We need to be intentional in nurturing that sense of belonging that is so important. It is through personal interaction that

we most effectively build and keep such bonds. We lost some of that during the pandemic, and it has been hard to bring that back to the same level, for a variety of reasons. Some are still concerned about their safety and health, which I fully understand. Some, especially those who might find themselves to be more introverted, found the isolation during the pandemic to be rather comforting, and prefer to keep it that way, even now. And as I mentioned, the

convenience factor. It can be easy to simply just stay at home and watch worship on the computer, with a cup of coffee in our hand, wearing our pajamas.

Sometimes it is also about priorities. We live in a rather consumer-driven society where we have a lot to choose from, and I think the reality is that church is not always the priority. Sometimes there are family events, or sports games we don't want to miss out on. I get that. Things can get complicated.

And then there is value. What do we get out of church? Is it spiritually nurturing, or do we look to nurture our spirituality in other places?

What I have found so far at KLC is that there is a strong core here, and also energy, but I have also learned that the pandemic, as well as being between pastors for a good while, has not been easy. Transitions can be hard, but they are also opportu-

nities to do something new.

So, as we start this journey




together, I ask if you might be willing to commit/re-commit to the ministries of KLC, as we not only look at what is, but also prayerfully, where God might be calling us in this new environment. How might we be willing to engage? What changes might we want to see at KLC, and how might you be willing to be part of it?



Our theme for next year is "Blessed to be a blessing." There will be lots to come from our Mission Support team, as we move into the new year, but I ask that you might prayerfully start considering what that might mean for you, both on a personal as well as a communal level. What are some of the gifts God has blessed you with, and how might you share those blessings more fully? Are you willing and able to grow in sharing your financial resources with the church and our ministries in the year to

come? What about your spiritual gifts and passions? What are you good at, and what are you passionate about? The reality is that we have all been given gifts and abilities that we are called to use for the



sake of the greater good. So, as we move into the Advent and Christmas season, I ask that you might prayerfully consider how God might be nudging you to share your blessings in the coming year.

Please know that my door is always open. I would love to meet with every member who is connected to KLC these next few months, at your convenience. I want to get to know you personally. I want to hear your stories. I want to learn from you how I can best serve as your pastor, and what ideas you might have for KLC.

Wishing you God's peace, as we enter this Advent season. We pray also for peace in our troubled world, as we prepare for the coming of the Prince of Peace, Emmanuel, God with us.



#### PIZZA FUNDRAISER



#### THE KENT GRAND ORGAN

With the completion of The Gallery Organ, we turn to the final phase, the completion of the Chancel Organ, watching it be constructed before our eyes! We will have the work schedule soon. The final payment of the original contract is scheduled to be \$52,858, of which we have already raised \$33,013 (as of November 6), leaving only \$19,835 to still be raised. As you have no doubt noticed, the finish date has been pushed out due to supply problems caused by the pandemic, so in order to finish this project in a more timely fashion, we may need to raise a little more. In your year end giving, please consider a gift for this wonderful organ which will be an enhancement to both worship services and to the community in the form of concerts or as an instrument to accompany other groups.

They first served on the streets, then at the Unity Church, and later another local church with no running hot water! They eventually ended up serving the community dinner at KLC about six years ago.

Starting 3/2020, dinner was served outside the church due to Covid until 10/2022.


They receive donations from The Storehouse in Covington. These were only ingredients; the preparations and the cooking are up to them.


